


Graceland Cemetery, established in 1860, is a historic cemetery still serving its lot holders to this day. The property is viewed as an important green space on the City's north side. The cemetery's collection of trees has been certified as a level II arboretum by Chicago's Morton Arboretum.

The Trustees of the Graceland Improvement Fund carefully manage the over 2,000 trees and shrubs in the cemetery with prudent removal and annual planting plans. The recent emphasis has been to add color to the cemetery tree and shrub population, particularly in important corridors.

The Trustees welcome visitors to the cemetery to enjoy the history, architecture, horticulture and arboretum that is Graceland.
